





A biannual open-access journal which publishes articles, reviews and bibliographical notes of linguistics, history, cultural anthropology, and literary studies, written in Spanish or Portuguese, and whose subject is centred on the Hispanic and Portuguese worlds.

With its miscellaneous volumes and monographic issues, Itinerarios is consolidated as a framework for discussion, providing a rich and flexible platform for sharing advancements in research in all the disciplines that make up what has traditionally been known as Iberian and Ibero-American studies.

It is the best Hispanic and Latin American journal in Poland, one of the best Polish journals for literary (Q1), linguistic (Q2) and historical (Q2) studies in the new 2020 Scopus ranking.
