



INTERNAL CALL FOR MOBILITY FELLOWSHIPS OF THE ERASMUS+ COMMUNIKITE PROJECT FOR THE PARTICIPATION IN TECHNICAL AND ACADEMIC TRAINING COURSES IN THE UNIVERSITY OF BOLOGNA.

2 international mobility grants of the Erasmus+ COMMUNIKITE Project (2023-1-ES01-KA220-HED-000153956) are called for training courses at the University of Bologna for teaching and research staff.

The training stays will take place from the 26th to the 28th of May, 2025, in accordance with the program established by the aforementioned institution on the theme "Teaching methodologies to FL absolute beginners". The program will be aimed at the training of teaching staff and/or researchers in the field of foreign language teaching.

The following are the requirements to be able to apply for these grants:

- To be a member of the teaching or research staff of the University of Warsaw at the time of implementation of the mobility;
- To have a practical command of the language in which the training course will be conducted (English).

Priority will be given to (1) members of the COMMUNIKITE project, (2) junior teachers, and (3) to those persons who are currently being trained and have a research profile in foreign language didactics.

Those wishing to participate in this call must submit their updated curriculum vitae and a motivation letter before March 10th, 2025, at 12:00 (noon) to the email address k.szymankiewicz@uw.edu.pl.

This call will be decided by resolution of the director of the COMMUNIKITE Project of the University of Warsaw. The resolution will be made public on March 14th, 2025 on the official COMMUNIKITE website (communikite.usal.es), and the result will be notified by email to those interested and to the Project coordinators.

Personal data of candidates for employment shall be processed for recruitment purposes only. Your personal data shall be processed in the scope as indicated by employment law¹ (given name (names) and family name, date of birth, contact information as provided, education, professional qualifications, previous employment) for the purposes of this recruitment process², whereas other data³ shall be processed based on your consent which may take the following wording:
